He also wrote an amicus brief in the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in the "Don't Ask Don't Tell" case. He assisted a client in preparing testimony before Congress supporting the reauthorization of the Voting Rights Act. He authored a brief filed in the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals successfully challenging the constitutionality of INS regulations on behalf of a Kosovar Albanian applying for political asylum. Jonathan served as pro bono counsel in three immigration-related appeals in the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals. He negotiated a change in the policy of the Washington, D.C. police department regarding the unconstitutional use of a collateral requirement as applied to homeless individuals. Jonathan also provided insurance-related advice with respect to the federal September 11 Victims' Compensation Fund.

Prior to entering private practice, Jonathan served as a law clerk for Judge Ferdinand Fernandez of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. Additionally, he assisted Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg of the U.S. Supreme Court in preparing for her confirmation hearing before the Senate Judiciary Committee.
